


Look at the picture of the mum rabbit and see if you can spot her six little babies hiding.





DID YOU KNOW... A baby rabbit is called a kitten!






### **AUTUMN/WINTER**

Mammals usually have hair or fur


They do not lay eggs



DID YOU KNOW... Many nocturnal animals have good night vision!




### **AMAZING PETS**

Dogs must wear a collar and ID tag when they are outside. Design this collar. What colour will it be? Will it have a pattern?






DID YOU KNOW... Dogs need to be walked daily in all weathers.


### A DAY ON THE FARM



Farmers make sure their animals are looked after and have everything they need to be happy.



















### A DAY ON THE FARM

Farm animals produce lots of things that we can eat or use in other ways, like to make clothes.


