Welcome to Scottish SPCA Animal WISE!

For many years, the Scottish SPCA has been delivering FREE workshops in secondary schools across Scotland and, as educational strategies have changed, we are keen to do even more to support and inspire the next generation.

We want to support every school in Scotland as a key partner, and not just through delivery of one-off annual workshops. We want to support young people's health and wellbeing; enhance their skills when it comes to literacy and numeracy; offer innovative ways to engage with STEM and inspire future career pathways.

By working together, we believe we can support schools in Scotland to nurture empathy, compassion and a greater sense of appreciation for animal welfare in Scotland.



What is Animal WISE?

We want to provide unique opportunities that empower pupils to be pioneers within their schools and have a positive impact on the wider community. **Animal WISE** encourages pupils of all ages and abilities to work together, increase their knowledge and awareness of animal welfare and be inspired to make a difference through engaging with various educational activities.

Animal WISE has four key components:



WATCH

We need to **WATCH** interactions between humans and animals making sure everyone is kept safe. We need to increase young people's knowledge on animal welfare and encourage them to be responsible animal citizens.



INFORM

We want to **INFORM** young people that animals matter and instil the belief that they experience emotions and they deserve compassion and empathy.



SUPPORT

We want to **SUPPORT** young people to help teach the importance of animal welfare and being a responsible citizen, taking into account developmental stage. We also want to support those who are maybe showing behaviours towards animals that are a cause of concern and work together with others to ensure that young person has the opportunities to succeed.



ENCOURAGE

We want to **ENCOURAGE** young people to report concerns about an animal and encourage them to ask questions, express themselves and develop their inquisitive minds in order to test their knowledge as well as ours.

FREE Workshops and Resources

Animal Advocates

At the Scottish SPCA we aim to prevent cruelty and bring those found guilty of such acts to justice. In our **Animal Advocates** workshop, the classroom becomes a court room as we use a real life investigation to generate discussion and debate.

This interactive workshop involves one of our education team visiting your class for approximately one hour. In this time, the class will get the chance to delve into a historic real life Scottish SPCA casefile. They will get the chance to read evidence, interviews and statements from vets and Scottish SPCA inspectors before taking on characters such as the defendent, the prosecution and the sherrif in a court case role play.

Focused this year on a cattle neglect case, the Animal Advocates workshop really gets young people thinking about the circumstances behind animal cruelty and, on a wider, level the social issues that are often linked to it. It explores the myriad reasons that people may be intentionally or unintentionally cruel, how sometimes this can be linked to mental health concerns, and how it can be prevented in the future.

The Animal Advocates workshop can also be adapted to be carried out in an outdoor setting within the school grounds to meet with coronavirus restrictions. These are subject to rescheduling in the event of adverse weather.

Please be assured we work to strict Covid-19 protocols whilst participating in any outdoor workshop and are happy to send through our risk assessments for your attention.



Animal Ambassadors

Our online workbook, '**Animal Ambassadors**', can be downloaded from our website at <u>scottishspca.org/animal-wise</u>

In this workbook, young people will explore some of the animal welfare issues that we face in Scotland, from the illegal puppy trade to the use of fireworks and why it's so important that we raise public awareness about these issues.

Pupils are asked to imagine they are the newest recruit in the Scottish SPCA's communications team. They will come up with unique campaigns to help educate the public about the impact of these key issues over five topics.

Project planning, research, creating different texts and infographics to convey key messages are just some of the skills that can be developed whilst working through this fun and challenging resource.



FREE E-learning opportunities

We want to make sure that our engagement with pupils is ongoing, which is why we have introduced an exciting new digital platform. You can use this platform to prepare for our upcoming visit and pupils can continue to learn about the Scottish SPCA and animal welfare after their workshop. These will include a mixture of interactive games, quizzes, videos and blogs and will ensure fun, engaging learning to expand knowledge on animal welfare.

Our E-learning modules cover a variety of topics which include:











Animal Guardians

In 2018 we launched our pioneering Animal Guardians programme, which involves us working with young people on an individual basis who may be struggling with showing empathy and compassion towards animals. If not addressed, this can lead to either the young person or the animal being hurt.

Our sessions are designed to help nurture a young person's relationship with animals, encourage that recognition of both human and animal emotions and ultimately ensure they act safely around their own pets or animals they encounter out with the home. We also run events during the school holidays as a way of staying in touch with all those who have been part of the Animal Guardians programme.

A young person can be referred on to the **FREE** programme by anyone that is directly involved with their care, for example parents/carers, teachers, social workers etc.



Developing the Young Workforce

We have worked hard to ensure that our authentic learning opportunities for young people tie in with many areas of the Curriculum for Excellence. We want pupils to have positive learning experiences whilst obtaining vital skills to enable them to become successful learners, confident individuals, effective contributors and responsible citizens.

Through engaging with all of the activities the Scottish SPCA has to offer, young people are given the opportunity to develop:

- Self-awareness.
- Respect for animals and people.
- Skills of enquiry and critical thinking and the ability to apply these to animal welfare issues.
- The ability to communicate in different ways and settings.
- An appreciation of a wide range of animals found in Scotland and their environment.
- A sense of injustice and a commitment to tackling it.
- A desire to protect our environment.
- Empathy and compassion.
- Belief that animals are sentient beings.
- Skills in problem solving.
- Creativity.
- Enterprise opportunities.
- An understanding of the link between animal and human health and wellbeing.

Working with Scotland's animal welfare charity is rewarding and fulfilling. We are a successful, modern and progressive charity with exciting plans for the future.



Our Animal Rescue and Rehoming Centres

We care for around 20,000 animals a year within our nine animal rescue and rehoming centres, which are located throughout Scotland.

Our teams look after all sorts od animals, from furry companions such as cats and dogs, to feathered friends and even scaly reptiles. Our experienced animal care staff can show young people what it's really like to care for our animals and the hard work it entails.
